## **MEDICAL CONDITIONS**

Students with medical conditions as per following will not be accepted for registration and will be terminated from study. It is a mandatory requirement from the Government of Malaysia and approved by the University Senate to protect the health of Malaysian residents and to reduce the potential burden on the public health service in Malaysia.

The university reserves the right to refuse admission based on these justifications:

- Infectious
- Difficult to cure over long term
- High treatment cost
- Disease /condition that can endanger oneself or others
- Treatment and complications can affect the studies
